

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Kick off Workshop for the development of a Country investment plan for the Federal Republic of Nigeria on transhumance and related topics.

19th -20th April 2023, Abuja, NIGERIA.

1. SUMMARY

Purpose of the Workshop	Organize a kick-off workshop to develop the Country Investment Plan (CIP) for Nigeria
Objectives of the Workshop	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To bring together in a workshop all the sectoral and concerned stakeholders in the CIP process, the partners, State/ministries’ representatives, and the CIP country working group resulting from the Meeting with Country Experts in Douala Cameroon) • To plan the organization of other workshops for thematic work groups to complete the initial data collection sheets of the CIP framework. • To establish the CIP drafting team for Nigeria that will submit a draft document which will be validated and integrated into the consolidated West Block CIP.
Expected results	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Following the workshop, the Nigeria CIP data is consolidated and transmitted to the Task Force in charge of the CIP drafting process. • A Road map for the CIP Nigeria drafting process is available, including recommendation for the institutional anchorage (leading line ministry). • The CIP drafting team produce the first skeleton of the CIP Nigeria and align it to the West Block Investment Plan at block level.
Description	The Ndjamen Declaration geographical blocks are multi-country platforms that bring together the countries which participated in the Ndjamen International Conference of the Ministers in January 2019. The Blocks also represent several transboundary protected areas and/or transboundary corridors for transhumance, more so the East-Central-West Blocks. The GIZ BSB Project is the leader of the West Block. In relation with the recommendations made during the "Transhumance Day" in Kinshasa in December 2020, several actions were proposed, including the preparation and development of Country investment plans (extension of the programmatic frameworks and budgeted roadmaps) for the countries concerned by the N'Djamena Declaration. The topics covered include transhumance, transboundary collaboration in PA management, sustainable access to natural resources, peace and security, and socio-economic development.
Participants	30 participants from relevant sectors of the Ministries in charge of protected areas, livestock and defence, technical and financial partners and conservation and transhumance local actors.
Location	The proposed location for the workshop is Abuja, Nigeria.
Covid 19 measures	The situation of the Covid 19 pandemic requires participants at all levels to make sure they comply with the officially promulgated health measures and the GiZ's, during travel and meetings.
Achievement indicator	An investment plan for Nigeria is finalized and available for integration into the overall West Block CIP.

2. BACKGROUND

The N'Djamena Declaration addresses the need to shape the framework for cross-border collaboration, the dynamics of transhumance at the regional level, taking into account security issues, the management of protected areas and the increasing degradation of ecosystems resulting from the effects of climate change. Through this Declaration, the States located in the northern part of the Congo Basin, the Sahelian countries that border these countries and the regional organizations, all commit to a common approach aimed at supporting peaceful transboundary transhumance, protecting the environment, agriculture, livestock and security. At this conference, the participants recommended that the Co-leaders of the geographical blocks provide support to the countries concerned **for the development of a budgeted three-year operational roadmap** and the establishment of a governance mechanism for monitoring the implementation of the N'Djamena Declaration. The three-year plan has evolved into the Country Investment Plan, which summarizes the priority actions to be taken over the next few years.

The strategic axes of intervention of the CIP are:

- Strategic axis 1: Development of pastoral spaces & sustainable management of the resources.
- Strategic axis 2: improvement of livestock systems (transhumance and pastoralism)
- Strategic axis 3 : Improvement of pastoral infrastructures.
- Strategic axis 4: Development of support measures for local, national, sub-regional actors.
- Strategic axis 5: "One Health" approach in the management of pastoralism & cross-border transhumance.
- Strategic axis 6: Support the management of protected areas located in transhumance zones.
- Strategic axis 7: Improving the living conditions of indigenous and local communities.

3. OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP

The guideline of the programmatic logical framework puts emphasis on the major and strategic results of the implementation of the N'Djamena Declaration, namely: (1) the national and sub-regional legal framework; (2) the management of protected areas and anti-poaching strategies; (3) the sustainable management of natural resources and hence transhumance; (4) the communication strategies for transboundary protected areas and transhumance; and (5) the peace and security component in connection with protected areas and transhumance. The objectives of the Kick Off Workshop are to:

- To bring together in a workshop all the sectoral stakeholders concerned by the process of developing the Nigeria CIP (partners, State/Line Ministries, and the country work group).
- To organize thematic work groups to conduct the initial data collection for the CIP.
- To establish the CIP drafting team for Nigeria that will submit a draft document which will be validated and integrated into the consolidated West Block CIP.

4. EXPECTED RESULTS

The expected results are:

- The CIP drafting team (Task Force in charge of the drafting process) is established.
- The first set of data collected for the CIP Nigeria is available.

- A Kickoff Workshop is conducted to gather at the same table the sectoral stakeholders concerned by the process of developing the Nigeria CIP (partners, State/ Line Ministries, and the country work group).

5. TOPICS AND WORK GROUPS

The discussions will be organized in three groups around the following topics:

GROUP 1:

Strategic axis 1: Development of pastoral space and sustainable management of pastoral resources.

Strategic axis 2: Improvement of livestock systems (transhumance and pastoralism).

GROUP 2:

Strategic Area 3: Improvement of pastoral infrastructures.

Strategic Area 4: Development of support measures for local, national, and sub-regional actors

GROUP 3:

Strategic Area 5: Integration of the "One Health" approach in the management of pastoralism and cross-border transhumance. Mobility and security.

Strategic Area 6: Support for the management of protected areas located in transhumance areas.

Strategic Area 7: Improving the living conditions of indigenous and local communities.

6. WORKSHOP METHODOLOGY

The workshop will bring together participants from Nigeria: sectoral stakeholders, partners, local actors, and experts supporting the process. The CIP themes, methodologies and approaches will be presented and discussed. The workshop will take place in plenary and in working groups.
