## 14th Summit of the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD)

## Geneva, 23 January 2024.

The 14th Summit of the Global Forum on Migration and Development (GFMD) opened on Monday 22 January 2024 in Geneva, Switzerland. For four days, a number of States, NGOs and stakeholders will discuss the major challenges linked to migration and the priorities for political action.

Under the aegis of the Co-Facilitator of France, Ambassador Christophe Guilhou, the Congo Basin Forest Partnership (CBFP) is taking part in the GFMD and is organising a side event on Wednesday 24 January 2024, from 5.00 pm to 6.30 pm (virtual), on the theme: Meeting between the countries of the Sahel and northern equatorial Africa - challenges related to cross-border transhumance, the survival of protected areas, natural resources and human lives, development, peace and security.

The side event aims to explore the main results of the implementation of the <u>N'Djamena Declaration on peaceful transhumance</u> between the countries of the Sahel and northern Equatorial Africa, through a presentation of case studies of the investment plans adopted by the eight countries of the N'Djamena Declaration in Yaoundé, at the 2nd International Conference of Ministers on Transhumance, held in July 2023.
